# Language Arts

#### Middle School Language Arts

The middle school Language Arts program at Beaches Chapel School focuses on several different areas. The development of reading, writing and grammar skills is the primary function of our curriculum. However, it is also our desire to encourage our students to develop a love for literature and an understanding of how the written and spoken word shapes and influences our world.

Sixth, seventh and eighth graders have the opportunity to read a variety of literary works throughout the school year. Each grade level reads at least one novel each quarter. They

are exposed to such authors as Wilson Rawls, Lois Lowry, Linda Sue Park, Christopher Paul Curtis, John Steinbeck, Edgar Allan Poe and Langston Hughes, just to name a few. We also utilize our close reading skills to read and analyze short stories and poetry. Overall, the goal is to instill a love and appreciation for reading and communicating.

Middle school is a time of preparation. It is imperative that as we read, evaluate and discuss, we look towards what will be required and expected

in high school. Vocabulary, writing, grammar, communication, and reading are the building blocks that will allow us to successfully transition to the rigorous expectations of high school.

#### **High School Language Arts**

High School English encompasses four areas of Language Arts: reading, writing, speaking, and listening.

The novels and plays taught reflect a variety of time periods, cultures, and backgrounds. We read classic literature, including authors such as Shakespeare, Steinbeck, and Fitzgerald, along with more contemporary writing and plays, by writers such as Ernest J Gaines, Sue Monk Kidd and Arthur Miller.

Students are challenged to read beyond the lines by making inferences, drawing conclusions, and identifying author's purpose. There is a heavy emphasis on writing, focusing on a variety of styles including expository, persuasive, analysis, and research.

Students examine texts with a close reading and learn to 'unlock' the meaning within a literary work. There is an understanding and appreciation of the writer's style, language, and, setting.
